This is what happened...

Peter Cane Legal Reasoning Prize 2018 for Yr12 and Yr13 students.

The third Peter Cane Prize for Legal Reasoning by an Aspiring Lawyer (2019) is now open to applicants (deadline Monday 4th Feb 2019 at 5 PM).

The prize was launched in 2017 and seeks to promote engagement with the ideas and reasoning behind law and legal studies, and particular to encourage those from all backgrounds and walks of life to apply to engage with the academic study of law The prize is named after the distinguished lawyer, Professor Peter Cane, an internationally acclaimed scholar of legal theory, obligations and public law, and Corpus' first dedicated law fellow.

The final shortlisted candidates each year are invited to attend an afternoon event at Corpus Christi, with legal workshops and an award ceremony, which in 2019 will take place on Tuesday 12 March.
