

Early Careers programmes are one of the very best ways of attracting new diverse and committed people to the bank and equipping them with the skills they need to succeed.

- Work experience programme: The programme offers a five-day shadowing experience to students in the later years of full-time secondary education, sixth form or college. The programme was set up with the idea to help young people gain an insight into a professional environment, as well as the banking industry. All Work Experience opportunities will be available through June, July and August 2021, the applications will go live in November this year.
- Foundation Apprenticeship programme: Since 2011, HSBC have recruited over 1000 new to bank apprentices. The programme provides an opportunity to people for a rewarding career with HSBC. The Foundation level 3 apprenticeship is typically for junior roles and for people taking their first step in to the banking industry. The programme runs for a duration of approximately 18 months. This programme has provided HSBC with a diverse and committed workforce who driven to succeed.
- **Degree Apprenticeship programme:** In 2019, HSBC recruited the first cohort of Degree Apprentices. The programme is designed to be an alternative route to the world of work and attaining a degree. The programme is aimed at people who have completed further education, who wish to learn as they work. The programme is 4 years in duration, rotating every 12 months into a new role, whilst studying their degree. To help them achieve this, they are allocated one day a week to study.







Who can apply?

This programme is aimed at those in the later years of full-time secondary, sixth form or college education who are keen to get an introduction to what a career in banking and financial services may be like.

The Work Experience placement takes place throughout June, July and August yearly. Specific details regarding each opportunity are available on the application page. Each location can house numerous placements, so please apply for the location closest to you and state a preference (if you have one) for a specific area during the application process.

Please note, knowledge of the banking and financial services sector is not required for you to apply.

To be considered for the programme, you will:

- •Be in full-time education at secondary school, sixth form or college at the time of the work experience commencing (June/August the following year from the point of application).
- •Be keen and motivated to find out more about HSBC and be prepared to complete the application process, which will include some online questions and, if successful, a telephone interview.







Work Experience-How to apply

Opportunities will be on the site in Nov this year.

You will be re-directed to a jobs page which holds all of the available locations for the Work Experience programme. We encourage you to choose and apply for a location to which you can reasonably commute. This programme can be highly competitive, so we recommend applying as early as possible to avoid disappointment. Applications will close when all placements are filled, and we will not be able to offer placements in locations not listed.

Please ensure you obtain prior approval from your school, sixth-form or college to undertake this work experience as it falls within the standard school/college term-time.

What to expect

Your placement will consist of shadowing HSBC colleagues, with a platform to ask questions to help you understand not only what the area you are placed in does, but also what it is like to work at HSBC UK. 

Pathways to Law is a widening participation scheme for students from under-represented backgrounds, who are interested in a career in law. This two year programme aims to raise aspirations of young people, increase social mobility and help more young people progress into the legal sector.

In 2019/20, just under 60% of students who completed the Pathways to Law programme at the University of Leeds, were offered a place to study Law at the University.

Students who complete the Pathways to Law programme at any University who run the Pathways to Law programme, may be eligible for a contextual offer to study in the School of Law at Leeds. This is in line with the access to Leeds criteria.

The Pathways to Law programme offers a unique opportunity for students in Year 12 and 13 to experience what it would be like to study Law at University as well as work in the legal sector.
