Please encourage your son to make use of the sessions on offer, and not leave their revision until the last minute. Closer to the examinations there may be more sessions on offer.

In Science pupils complete end of chapter tests as we go along, to inform them and us of their progress towards their target grade. This also is to try to encourage pupils to get into good study habits and not leave all their revision until the last minute. Your son will be sitting GCSE Additional Science (sets 3-7) or GCSE Chemistry, Physics and Biology (sets 1 & 2) in May/June. They will also complete their ISA (Controlled Assessment) at an appropriate point in the year when it fits in with the topic they are covering in class. This will counts for 25% of their final grade. Pupils will be prepared in class for this.

Past papers and mark schemes for all Science subjects are available for free to download from www.aqa.org.uk, simply select Past Papers and choose the relevant subjects. For year 11 sets 3-7 please select the unit 2 papers. Year 11 sets 1-2 will need to use all three units for each science subject. Pupils should be encouraged to make use of these.

All pupils also have access to an online programme, <u>www.kerboodle.com</u>. They have their own log in details- if your son cannot log in he needs to let one of his science teachers know to reset

his password. On this website pupils have got access to the Science textbooks, as well as revision materials such as podcasts and quizzes.

You may be aware that two teachers from the department are currently absent. Please rest assured that we have got fully trained, qualified and experienced Science supply teachers covering these classes, until such times as Miss Draper and Mr Mc Carron return.

Pupils in sets 3-7 who have not achieved a grade C in their Science A Examination in year 10 are being offered the chance to resit this GCSE in May/June. This involves resitting all 3 Science A exam papers and an ISA. The ISA will take place in class. This is on top of their examinations and ISA for Additional Science. Pupils will be expected to do their own revision for this, but there will be revision in class close to the examinations. Obviously this is extra work on top of all the other GCSEs your son will be sitting this year, however if they achieve a Grade C it is another qualification that they will have.

Pupils who have achieved a Grade C or above may resit if they have good reason to wish to do so and it is felt by their teachers that they will improve their grade. This will be looked at on an individual basis.
