Mr Anasoh provided our secret agents (**code name: Section 002**) with the IT equipment needed for the mission.

For those of you who have never heard of the GCHQ, this is what you need to know:

Government Communications Headquarters, commonly known as **GCHQ**, was set up in 1919; it is an intelligence and security organisation responsible for providing signals intelligence (SIGINT) and information assurance to the government and armed forces of the United Kingdom. Based in "The Doughnut" in the suburbs of Cheltenham, GCHQ is the responsibility of the country's Secretary of State for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs. It works with MI5 and MI6. It has been responsible for cracking enemy codes and thus helping us win wars.

The Mission

You are working in a mixed team of analysts from GCHQ and the National Crime Agency (NCA). Your mission is to break up a major international drugs smuggling ring by tracking a concealed shipment of drugs and preventing it from reaching the UK.

In the course of this morning, you will be faced with a series of challenges which will test your linguistic and analytical skills. Bits of information are reaching you all the time and you must piece them together. You must work against the clock to solve these tasks to establish:

- An identikit picture of the courier / drug trafficker
- Where and when the handover of the drugs from the courier to the UK contact will take place
- How the drugs consignment will be transported from place of origin to the rendez-vous point

You have until **11.25am** to solve the challenges, complete your report sheet and prepare a briefing for your law enforcement partners.

Background

Khalif is a known UK-based drugs smuggler involved in an international drugs smuggling ring with links to cocaine producers in Colombia. He is suspected of being the UK contact in a major drugs smuggling operation codenamed OPERATION KRYPTON, aimed at importing cocaine to the UK. Your task is to uncover details of the operation and identify the courier, who you believe calls himself **Vladimir**. You want to track the courier so you can establish the identity of the UK contact but at the moment you don't know what he looks like.

Khalif and his contacts are known to speak Korean and Arabic in addition to French/Spanish/German.



THE TASKS

Preparation

As the drugs gang are known to speak Korean and Arabic, you will need to understand more about these languages in order to help you in your investigations. 3 of you have been asked to learn some Korean and 3 Arabic. This should have been done in advance. Basic crypt training will be given to you.

Task 1

HQ has intercepted an audio message. Listen to it very carefully. What vital information does it give you? Enter any important information on the answer sheet in readiness to feed back to HQ.

Task 2

NCA has provided HQ with some additional information that they have retrieved, but they need your linguistic expertise to make sense of it. (Your teacher will have this information for you) What do you make of it? Enter this further information on the answer sheet.

Task 3

You are now on the trail of the courier and are tracking him across France/Germany/Spain. The information clues that you receive will be appearing on the event screen at random intervals from 10.00. Make sure you don't miss any!

Task 4

Send an encoded message using Fr/Ger/Sp as your base language to the drug smuggler so that he/she is unaware that the operation has been compromised and telling him what time to meet so that you can catch him. Maximum 40 words. You must include an Arabic number as you know this is the sort of thing that the gang do. You will have a separate worksheet for this. Submit by 11.25.

Task 5

HQ have asked to interview your team between 11.00 and 11.30. We will let you know the exact time via your teacher. As you are new to GCHQ they would like to check your foreign language skills and will be conducting the interview in Fr/Ger/Sp. There will be one question each:

- Tell us 3 things that you have already found out about Vladimir.
- What have you learned about GCHQ?
- Why do they need linguists?
- How are you working as a team? Who is doing what?
- What are the most important elements of team work?
- What have you enjoyed most this morning?

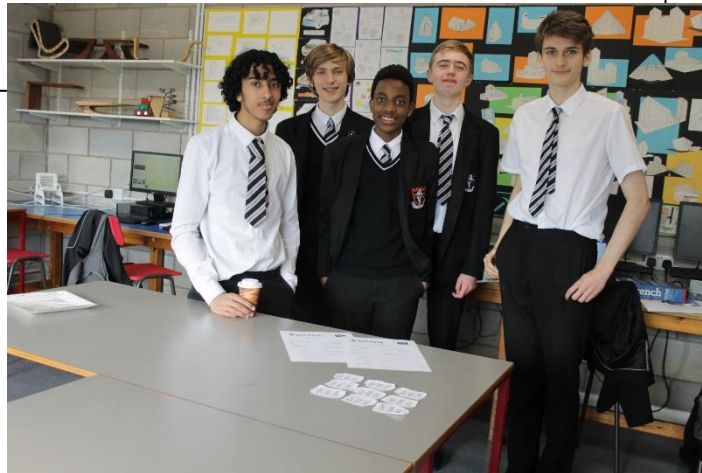

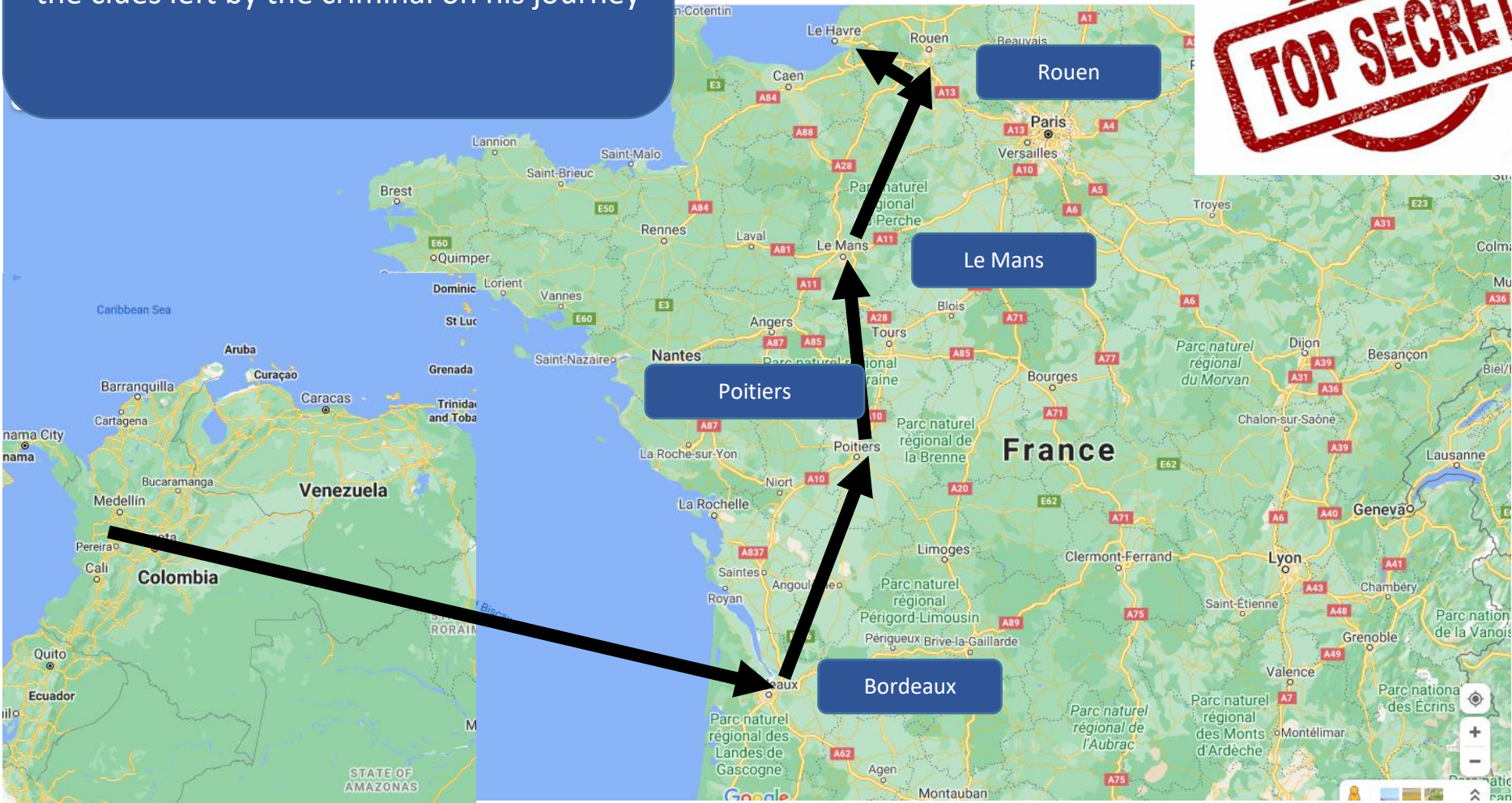

TASK 4

Creating an enciphered message.

This should be a maximum of 40 words and is designed to be a false one from Vladimir to the UK contact, who you believe is Khalif.

Send an encoded message to Khalif using French as your base language as if you were Vladimir so that Khalif is unaware that the operation has been compromised. You can give him further details and include what time to meet so that you can catch him. You must include some Arabic numbers as you know this is the sort of thing that the gang do.

This enciphered message was sent to Khalif:
